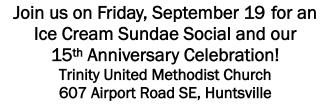

Let's Go Touring!!

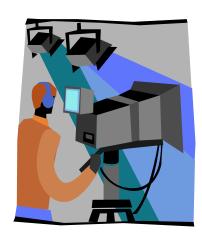
