The Administration and Finance Committee has an important role in keeping the wheels turning for the OLLI at UAH organization. Chaired by the First Vice-President of the OLLI Board of Directors, the Committee has planning and sustainment responsibilities for OLLI financial management. In addition, it has oversight duties for maintaining OLLI's regulating documents; i.e., by-laws, policies and procedures.

Work for the A&F Committee begins as soon as new OLLI officers are installed at the Annual Membership Meeting in May. First order of business is reviewing the treasurer's report at a line item level in order to kick-off the next fiscal year's budget process. The OLLI standing committee chairs are requested to submit annual budget numbers to the A&F Committee, based on past performance and current expectations. The months

leading up to the start of the fiscal year in August are devoted to preparing the end-of-year accounting reports and getting the operating budget established for the new year.

By the time the doors open at UAH for OLLI Fall term students, the A&F sub-committees have met to formulate work plans, review procedures and start their special tasks, such as, conduct annual financial audit and make IRS report, update OLLI equipment inventory, provide OLLI undergraduate Scholarship and Member Financial Assistance committee support. Ad hoc committees are formed as needed to consider new ideas or resolve issues. All of these activities are reported to PCS and the OLLI Board of Directors for their review and approval as we progress through the year.

A&F Committee work is challenging and rewarding. It's a good place to learn what it takes to run an OLLI program like ours. We invite members to join us at our "first Friday of the month" meetings. ### May 4 – Dramatic Changes in the US Economy and the Impact on the Stock Market Dirk Drawe

It seems as if recent articles indicating that domestic manufacturing is "losing its spark" abound. If that's true, why has there been a concomitant increase in the financial sector? Join our own Dirk Drawe as he helps us understand this mystery, and explains that the increase is due in part to the easy credit policy of the Federal Reserve and has contributed to a rapid growth of the stock market. This growth is not due to fundamentals and is unsustainable. The key is to recognize how this took place and make wiser investments.

If you love architecture, don't miss this chance to hear "first hand" about the only structure designed by Frank Lloyd Wright in the state of Alabama, and the only such house in the southeast that is open to the public. Wright designed the Usonian beginning in 1936 as the answer to affordable housing in the United States. The Rosenbaum House, located in Florence, AL, is considered to be the purest example of this unique architecture. Learn how Wright's organic concepts flow through the house from the exterior design to the interior furnishings.







## SPECIAL EVENTS COMMITTEE

This is my final report to *The Insider* as Chair of the Special Events Committee. During my three years as Chair, the Committee has evolved to encompass more offerings, namely movies and long trips. We have also continued to offer tours of local industries and institutions. All has gone well except for a few postponements due to weather. I think I attended almost all the movies and I recall each one with fondness. These and other offerings currently are advertised to all 1200 plus members, whether they pay for courses or just the annual OLLI membership fee. What a great deal!

Since my OLLI Board term concludes at the annual meeting in May, I want to thank all the members who have in any way contributed to the success of Special Events. The number of events and attendees has grown over the last 3 years.

The final tour was of the third floor of the new UAH nursing building that includes simulated learning using high tech manikins linked to computer feedback programs. Students learn interactively from their instructors, while other faculty observes techniques from a distance. Our tour guides were graduate nursing students, and they fielded our questions without hesitation. There were many positive comments about the tour. A second tour took place at the end of the first one.

By the time you read *The Insider*, the Film Fest will have concluded with two movies that were postponed earlier due to the threat of bad weather. On Friday, April 29, *My Cousin Vinny* and *Secondhand Lions* were shown. The format of showing a set of movies with a theme seems to have potential and the first Film Fest featured funny movies. ## Birgit Stensby's Cranberry/Walnut Gelatin recipe

#### **Ingredients:**

- One 6-oz pack of gelatin (raspberry or cherry flavors work best)
- 8 oz. FROZEN cranberries (do not thaw!) 2/3 of standard 12 oz. bag (need to buy these in season and freeze for later use)
- 4 large stalks celery
- 3 oz. walnut pieces
- One 20 oz. can of crushed pineapple in its own juice
- 1. Drain pineapple for about an HOUR, reserving all juice in measuring cup.
- 2. Combine gelatin mix with 2 cups boiling water; stir until completely dissolved. To the reserved pineapple juice (usually about a cup) add enough cold water to make 2 cups; add in and stir to combine. Set in refrigerator for 60-90 minutes.
- 3. When gelatin begins to set, add the remaining ingredients:
- 4. Add pineapple by tablespoon, or else it will all clump together and will be hard to separate. Chop celery and add in. Chop FROZEN cranberries in food processor and add in. Last, add walnuts and stir together well. Chill overnight.
- 5. Recipe may be halved if using a 3-oz gelatin package.

#### Tips for making this:

- 1. Plan ahead and buy cranberries when they're available late in the year; freeze them for later use. After stores run out of stock (usually around Christmas), there won't be any more until the next fall.
- 2. Don't use thawed cranberries nor any kind of canned cranberries.
- 3. Drain pineapple for an hour; it takes this long for the liquid to percolate down. If there is a little liquid left which drains later, it's OK to add to the partially-set gelatin.
- 4. Don't start this late in the day, since draining and setting times are substantial and shouldn't be cut short.

She was a paralegal for a prominent New Mexico criminal defense lawyer who later became a NM Supreme Court Justice. In Albuquerque she owned and operated a weekend pottery business while she worked full-time. She taught pottery at the Madison County Senior Center. John Burnett was born in Notch Hill, British Columbia, Canada, then moved to Vancouver living there through high school. He attended the Royal Canadian Naval Technical School in Victoria, British Columbia, where he earned a bachelor's degree in Marine Engineering.
