DINE OUT



FORT PAYNE: TREASURES OF NW ALABAMA













To celebrate the 200th anniversary of the statehood of Alabama, many of the summer activities included visits to historic and cultural sites in North Alabama. First stop was Fort Payne, AL where members got an inside look into the newly renovated Alabama Fan Club and Museum.

Members then explored the city of Fort Payne and it's natural beauty to include DeSoto State Park, 3,502 acres nestled atop Lookout Mountain. The park was developed in the late 1930's and lines Little River Canyon. The rushing waterfalls and fragrant wildflowers are breathtaking.

Next stop on the tour was the Fort Payne Depot Museum. It was built in 1891 for the Alabama - Great Southern Railroad. After approximately 85 years, the railroad announced plans to close and dismantle the depot. The building was restored and was turned in to a museum as it stands today!

The grand finale was a visit to Orbix Hot Glass. Members got to learn glass blowing techniques and take home some handmade glassware.

All members must complete a **NEW** OLLI permit application to receive a 2019 - 2020 Commuter Parking Permit. Permits from previous academic years are not valid.


Commuter permits are issued in the CPCS Registration Office, WIL 103.
